

When Courses are Audited

There may be times that a course appears on a high school's List of NCAA Courses in error. This may be due to changes in NCAA legislation or a course may have been erroneously submitted or approved.

When it becomes necessary to remove a course from a list, the NCAA Eligibility Center staff does so in an effort to keep a high school's list accurate, but also to make sure students who have taken such a course in the past are not negatively impacted by the removal.

For example, if "Health" appeared on a high school's List of NCAA Courses and was subsequently audited, it would appear as denied beginning the next academic year. For example, if the course was audited in January 2012 (during the 2011-12 academic year), the course would not be used if taken in 2012-13 and after. The course would be used if taken in 2011-12 and before. In this way, students who took the course in 2011-12 and before would still be able to use the course.
