



## 2024-25 DIVISION I COUNCIL-APPROVED REVIEW PROCESS AMATEURISM CERTIFICATION GUIDELINES

In the amateurism certification process, the NCAA Eligibility Center may apply relief, as follows:

1. **National/International Competition.** When a prospective student-athlete triggers the delayed-enrollment legislation due to national/international competition in countries that do not use a tiered elimination structure (e.g., tryouts, trials) for national team selection, relief from the season of competition and the academic year of residence (Bylaws 12.8.3.2.1.2 or 12.8.3.2.2.2) may be applied if competition in the event(s) was required to qualify for either the national team or events outlined in Bylaw 12.8.3.2.1.2-(a) or Bylaw 12.8.3.2.2.2-(a).

This relief may be applied if the country's National Governing Body provides either (a) contemporaneous national team selection standards or (b) a letter that specifies the selection standards and/or identifies the events in which the PSA participated that were required for national team selection.

2. **COVID-19 Delayed Enrollment Relief.** PSAs who have not previously enrolled full time at a collegiate institution, and whose legislated grace period concluded before or during the 2020-21 academic year, may engage in organized competition during the 2020-21 academic year without using a season of competition (Bylaws 12.8.3.2.1 or 12.8.3.2.2).
3. **Released Error Policy.** In accordance with its [released error policy](#), the Eligibility Center may consider an error in the waiver process.

**Note:** previous Division I Council-Approved Review Process (CARP) policies related to minimal competition and low level/minimally organized participation are now [legislated](#) (via the adoption of [Division I Proposal 2023-50](#) in January 2024) and thus have been removed from the 2024-25 CARP guidelines (see [Figure 12-2](#) for additional information regarding delayed-enrollment conditions).
