



INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE COURSE TITLES

The NCAA Eligibility Center approves submitted courses that meet NCAA core-course legislation and the criteria for approval in the [NCAA High School Review Committee Policies and Procedures](#). High schools that add weight to advanced level courses can have this weight applied to student certifications by the Eligibility Center, following NCAA course-weight guidelines. The following international baccalaureate courses meet NCAA core-course legislation and the criteria for approval, provided that the courses are [submitted in the appropriate subject area by the high school](#). **Note:** All titles below are approved at both the HL and SL levels.

Note: If one of these titles has been designated as “not approved” on a high school’s list of NCAA core courses:

1. Confirm the course has been submitted for review in the correct subject-area. The only courses eligible for approval in the additional discipline are world language, comparative religion or philosophy.
2. Review the “not approved” reason code language for further information.
