1. *Diploma d'Ensenyament Professional* [Diploma of Professional Education]

Expected Timeline of Completion	12 years (four years or eight semesters from the initial start of year nine)
Issuing Body	Secondary School
First Available Date of Issue (Typical)	June/July

Tier Two

1. *Titol de Batxiller Professional or Qualificacio Final de Batxillerat Professional* [Professional Baccalaureat]

Expected Timeline of Completion	13 years (five years or 10 semesters from the initial start of year nine)
Issuing Body	Secondary School
First Available Date of Issue (Typical)	June/July
