ACCEPTABLE FORMS OF PROOF OF HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION

1. General Secondary Education Certificate

Expected Timeline of Completion	12 years (four years or eight semesters from the initial start of year nine)
Issuing Body	State of Palestine Ministry of Education and Higher Education (MOEHE) Directorate of Education

2. Technical Secondary Education Certificate

Expected Timeline of Completion	12 years (four years or eight semesters from the initial start of year nine)
Issuing Body	State of Palestine Ministry of Education and Higher Education (MOEHE) Directorate of Education

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- » **Converting grades out of a value other than 100:** Grades are often issued with a “Minimum and Maximum Mark” for the class, followed by the “Student’s Mark” (the grade the student earned in the class). The grading scale above would apply to courses with a Maximum Mark of 100. For courses out of any other amount, the Student’s Mark should be divided by the Maximum Mark in order to convert the grade to a 100-point grade.

Example: A “Student Mark” of a 40 for a course with a Maximum Mark of 50 would be an 80 on the scale above.
