PURPOSE

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, also known as the Buckley Amendment, is a federal law designed to protect the privacy of education records. In higher education, students control access to their records, which can only be shared with people if the student provides written consent or if the student is a dependent.

This form provides students the ability to allow individuals (e.g., parent/legal guardian, high school staff, college/university personnel) to contact the NCAA for information relating to their education-impacting disability request and/or records. Without this form, the Eligibility Center will only be able to speak to the student regarding their EID.
