

NCAA Eligibility Center COVID-19 Response FAQs

For Students Initially Enrolling Full Time in the 2021-22 or 2022-23 Academic Year

Given the continuing impact of COVID-19 on the educational environment, the NCAA Eligibility Center has partnered with the NCAA membership to identify the following changes to the initial-eligibility certification process for students who initially enroll full time in an NCAA Division I or II school during the 2021-22 or 2022-23 academic year. The Eligibility Center will continue to monitor the environment and make necessary adjustments to prioritize health, safety and fairness for all prospective student-athletes.

COVID-19 Automatic Waiver Criteria for 2021-22 or 2022-23 Enrollment

- Q1: Given the unique circumstances due to COVID-19, will there be any flexibility in the initial-eligibility standard for students who initially enroll full time in a collegiate institution during 2021-22 or 2022-23?
- A1: Yes. Students who initially enroll full time in an NCAA Division I or II school during 2021-22 or 2022-23 will receive an automatic initial-eligibility waiver in the academic certification process that provides the highest level of relief for which they are eligible, per the criteria below:











WHAT IS ELIGIBILITY CENTER?

- A unit within the NCAA responsible for evaluating and certifying college-bound student-athletes for collegiate competition at Division I and II schools.
- We focus on:
 - Academic preparedness.
 - ▶ Sports participation.
 - ▶ High school courses.
 - Customer service.
- If you want to compete at an NCAA Division I or II school, you must meet NCAA Eligibility Center:
 - Academic initial-eligibility requirements.
 - Amateurism requirements.

TWO ACCOUNT TYPES

Register for a Profile Page or a Certification account at eligibilitycenter.org.





PROFILE PAGE ACCOUNT



You are interested in a Division III school or are not sure in which division you want to compete.



There is no registration fee to create a Profile Page account.



Transition to a Certification account at any time you wish to pursue a Division I or II path.



CERTIFICATION ACCOUNT




You must be certified by the NCAA Eligibility Center to compete at a Division I or II school.



The registration fee for domestic students is \$90. The fee for international students is \$150.



Before you take official visits or sign an NLI, you must have a complete Certification account.



- Review your Dashboard for open tasks.
- Update your graduation or Edit your account, schools enrollment dates if needed.
- View your receipt of transcripts on file.
- or sports information.



COLLEGE ADMISSIONS

- You must apply and be accepted to your NCAA DI or II school before you can compete on campus.
- Ask your NCAA school for more information about cost of attendance and financial aid.





You must be on an NCAA DI or II school's institution request list to get a certification.





Shared Responsibility

Communicate closely with your high school counselors, coaches, parents/guardians, college compliance office and mentors as you transition to college.

NATURAL/ **PHYSICAL** MATH SOCIAL **SCIENCE ENGLISH** (Algebra I **SCIENCE** or higher) (Including one year of lab, if offered)

- NCAA core courses are:
 - ▶ On your school's list of NCAA-approved core courses.
 - Taught at or above the high school's regular academic level.
 - Taught by a qualified instructor.
 - Considered four-year college preparatory.












DI nonqualifiers are not eligible to receive athletics aid, practice or compete their first year.






Test Scores

Standardized test scores are excluded from NCAA initial-eligibility criteria for students who initially enroll full time in an NCAA school during the 2020-21, 2021-22 and/or 2022-23 academic years.

However, colleges and/or scholarship programs may still require test scores.



DIVISION I: CORE-COURSE TIME LIMITATION



- When you enter ninth grade, you have four years (eight semesters) to complete your core-course requirement.
- You must graduate on time, with your class.



DIVISION I: CORE-COURSE TIME LIMITATION



Note: This approach will allow students impacted by school closures to complete additional core courses toward their initial eligibility.




Test Scores

Standardized test scores are excluded from NCAA initial-eligibility criteria for students who initially enroll full time in an NCAA school during the 2020-21, 2021-22 and/or 2022-23 academic years.

However, colleges and/or scholarship programs may still require test scores.



FLEXIBILITY IN INITIAL-ELIGIBILITY



Students who initially enroll full time in an NCAA school during 2021-22 or 2022-23 must meet specific criteria to be eligible.



INITIAL-ELIGIBILITY FOR ALL OTHER CLASSES





DIVISION III


- Each Division III college or university determines its own eligibility for:
 - Admission.
 - Financial aid.
 - Practice and competition.
- The NCAA EC does not perform certifications for Division III college-bound student-athletes.
- Division III studentathletes may register for a free Profile Page, but it is not required.





DISTANCE OR E-LEARNING


► The Eligibility Center will not require a separate review of distance or e-learning programs used during the 2021-22 and 2022-23 academic calendars in response to closures due to COVID-19.






DISTANCE OR E-LEARNING

Note: This policy will apply to students from all grade levels (e.g., freshmen, sophomores) who complete distance or e-learning courses during the 2020-21 and 2021-22 academic years.







Taking online or hybrid courses does not necessarily mean you are home schooled.





Home school students can also meet the COVID-19 Automatic Waiver criteria for 2021-22 enrollment. Review our Home School Toolkit for questions about home schooling.





AMATEURISM

- In general, amateurism requirements do not allow:
 - Contracts with professional teams.
 - Salary for participating in athletics.
 - Prize money above actual and necessary expenses.
 - Play with professionals.
 - Tryouts, practice or competition with a professional team.
 - ▶ Benefits from an agent or prospective agent.
 - Agreement to be represented by an agent.
 - ▶ Delayed initial full-time collegiate enrollment to participate in organized sports competition.





If you have questions, contact us before acting. Your actions may impact your future NCAA eligibility.

SPORTS PARTICIPATION

- When you register for a Certification account, you must:
 - Select the sport(s) you would like to play in college.
 - Update your information frequently if you play for multiple teams or attend events outside the traditional high school setting.
 - Request final amateurism before you enroll full time at a DI or II school.
- Note: Over 94% of students do not require additional questions from the EC after they request final amateurism.





PROACTIVE STUDENT ACTIONS

- If you want to play sports in college, you must:
 - Share your NCAA ID with schools recruiting you.
 - Apply to schools of your choosing to be accepted.
 - ▶ Request final amateurism certification before you enroll full time in college.
 - Starting April 1 (fall).
 - Starting Oct. 1 (winter/spring).
 - ▶ Ask your counselor to submit your final transcript with proof of graduation.
- Know that considerations are given to students with documented <u>education-impacting disabilities</u>.
