SUBJECT: Countable Opponents for Statistical Purposes.

Over the last several years, the NCAA media coordination and statistics staff has seen an increase in NCAA institutions playing non-member schools claiming to offer four-year degrees. On closer examination, it is evident these schools are focused solely on fielding athletics teams. We have found many of them offer exclusively online courses and have questionable curriculum and/or no academic mission.

Why Does This Matter?

We have heard from conference and institutional representatives from all three divisions regarding the authenticity of some of these schools. Competition against these teams has led to inflated statistics and results, some of which we feel have compromised the integrity of our national statistics and records. Therefore implementing a stronger policy is necessary.

Policy Change

The current NCAA statistics policy is borrowed from NCAA Bylaws 17, 20 and 31 and states that games are countable against varsity teams of four-year (or twoyear senior colleges), degree-granting institutions that play a majority of their contests against U.S and/or Canadian (Division II institutions only) college varsity teams.

We felt this policy was too broad and therefore inquired about making a change to the legislation. After meeting with governance staffs from each division, it was evident the change we sought concerning countable opponents would not be made by adjusting the bylaws. However, per Bylaw 31.9, the NCAA media

coordination and statistics staff has the authority to make changes to the statistics policies and procedures.

This is not a decision made solely by our staff. We have discussed the updated policy with our Media Coordination and Statistics Advisory Board, which consists of institutional and conference sports information directors from across all divisions, and that group endorses this change. We are also in the process of sharing this information with various NCAA championships oversight committees.

Therefore, effective August 1, 2015 a non-NCAA opponent must satisfy the attached requirements to be considered countable. Please note this policy is only applicable for statistical purposes and does not affect sport sponsorship requirements. Additionally, this policy change does not preclude an NCAA school from playing a non-countable opponent.

Also included on the attachment is a list of the non-countable institutions and rationale for each. Should you have any questions or concerns about any of the schools appearing on this list, please let me know as soon as possible. Similarly, if you have a question about another school that is not listed, please let us know so we may review that specific institution's case.

We recognize there may be institutions now listed as non-countable that NCAA member schools have played in the past. Statistics and records achieved against these teams prior to the 2015-16 academic year will still be recognized. Moving forward, however, we feel this is a prudent course of action allowing for fairness across all levels of the NCAA and ensuring contests are played against institutions that have received some form of accreditation.
