- ...a team went undefeated in the MCWS: Oregon St., 2007 (5-0)
- ...a team won six games at the MCWS: South Carolina, 201
- ...the National Champion was below .500 during its regularseason conference schedule:

Oregon St., 2007 (10-14 in Pac-10)

- ...the National Champion was seeded third or lower in its regional: Fresno St., 2008 (fourth seed at Long Beach Regional)
- ...the National Champion did not host the regional it won: Fresno St., 2008 (won Long Beach Regional)

 Clemson vs. Oklahoma, 6-22-2010 (delayed 32 minutes after the end of the fifth inning before being suspended. Game resumed on 6-23-10 with Oklahoma batting in the top of the sixth)

- ...two weather delays in the same game:
 6-20-2010 South Carolina vs. Oklahoma (a 4:15 delay prior to the start of the game and a 2:01 delay in the middle of the sixth)
- ...a team was involved in three weather delays during the CWS: Oklahoma, 2010 (two delays vs. LSU on June 20 and one delay on June 22)
- ...brothers were starters for the same team in a game: Raoul Torrez, 3b and Riccio Torrez, 1b, Arizona St. vs. North Carolina, 6-14-09 (5-2)
- ...a son played in the CWS, preceded by his father: Matt Newman, Arizona St., 2009 and Randy Newman, Arizona St., 1981
- ..two games were won in a team's final at-bat on the same day: Arizona St. vs. North Carolina (5-2, 10 inn.) & Texas vs. Southern Miss. (7-6), 6-14-09
- ...both games of a doubleheader ended with the same score: Arizona St. vs. Nebraska, and Baylor vs. Tulane, 6-21-05 (8-7)
- ..a team rallied after trailing by four or more runs in the eighth inning or later in a CWS game: TCU vs. Florida St., 11-7 (TCU trailed 7-3 entering the top of the eighth inning,

6-23-10)

...a team overcame a three-run deficit to win a championship series game:

Georgia vs. Fresno St., 6-23-08 (Down 6-3 heading into the bottom of the 8th inning, won 7-6)

- ...a team lost its 30th game of the year at the CWS: Fresno St. vs. North Carolina, 6-21-08 (3-4)
- ...both benches left the dugout:

La.-Lafayette vs. Clemson, 6-14-00 (5-4)

...a player was ejected from a game: Tyler Henley, cf, Rice vs. Oregon St., 7th inn., 6-21-06 (0-5)

- ...a coach was ejected from a game: George Horton, Cal St. Fullerton vs. UC Irvine, 13th inn., 6-18-07 (4-5)
- ...there was a crowd of less than 10,000 for a game: 8,267, Wichita St. vs. Long Beach St., 6-1-91 (8-5, Game No. 4)
- .there was a crowd of more than 30,000 for a game: 30,422, North Carolina vs. LSU, 6-19/20-08 (7-3, Game No. 10)
