...a player tossed a live ball into the stands as a souvenir:

Gary Burnham, If, Clemson vs. Miami (FL), 5-31-96 (3-7) (Rudy Gomez hit a double down the third base line and Burnham, thinking it was a foul, tossed the ball into the stands and Gomez was awarded home)

...a game was shortened because of rain:

South Carolina vs. Eastern Mich., 6 innings, 6-8-75 (5-1)

...a game took two days to finish due to rain:

Virginia vs. Ole Miss, 6-20/21-14 (4-1)

...two games were rained out on the same day:

6-13-00

...a tornado warning evacuated the press box:

6-20-11

...a game did not start on its scheduled day because of weather:

...a team lost its 30th game of the year at the CWS:

Fresno St. vs. North Carolina, 6-21-08 (3-4)

...both benches left the dugout:

La.-Lafayette vs. Clemson, 6-14-00 (5-4)

...a player was ejected from a game:

Tyler Henley, cf, Rice vs. Oregon St., 7th inn., 6-21-06 (0-5)

...a coach was ejected from a game:

George Horton, Cal St. Fullerton vs. UC Irvine, 13th inn., 6-18-07 (4-5)

...there was a crowd of less than 10,000 for a game:

8,267, Wichita St. vs. Long Beach St., 6-1-91 (8-5, Game No. 4)

...there was a crowd of more than 30,000 for a game:
