MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

In 1961, Western Mich. was 1-2 in the CWS and had no doubles despite hitting 6 triples.

The first team to play seven games in one CWS was the 1952 national champion Holy Cross team. The Crusaders used only 11 different players during the CWS: eight position players and three pitchers who combined for seven complete games.

Oregon State, in 2006, was the first team to lose two games at the CWS and still win the national championship. The Beavers lost their opening game to Miami (FL) and advanced through the losers' bracket to advance to the championship finals. Oregon State lost game one of the championship finals against North Carolina before winning the last two to claim the school's first

In 2007, Oregon State became the first team since LSU in 1996 and 1997 to win back-to-back national titles and the Beavers were the first team, since the bracket expanded to 64 teams in 1999, to win the national championship after being seeded third in its regional.

In 2008, Fresno State became the first team, since the bracket expanded to 64 teams, seeded fourth in its regional to make the CWS. The Bulldogs completed the Cinderella run by belting 14 CWS home runs and winning the national title.

In 2011, South Carolina went undefeated in 10 NCAA Tournament games, setting a record with 16 straight (dating back to the final six CWS games of 2010). Texas held the previous record with 15-straight NCAA Tournament wins in 1983-84. The Gamecocks extended their NCAA Tournament streak to 22 games until losing to Arkansas in the 2012 CWS. The 22-game win streak covered 2010-12

In 2013, Louisville became the ninth team to play in the CWS in the same year the institution's basketball team played in the Final Four (Bradley, 1950; Houston, 1967; UCLA, 1969; LSU, 1986; Kansas, 1993; Texas, 2003; North Carolina, 2008, North Carolina, 2009, Louisville, 2013). Louisville was also the fifth institution to play in a major bowl game, the Final Four and the CWS in the same academic year (LSU, 1985-86, Liberty Bowl; Kansas, 1992-93, Aloha Bowl; Texas, 2002-03, Cotton Bowl; North Carolina, 2008-09, Meineke Car Care Bowl*; Louisville, 2012-13, Sugar Bowl. *-North Carolina football vacated all of its wins during the 2008 football season.
