Highlights

Wildcats Net Championship By 21 Shots: Arizona fired the two lowest rounds of the tournament, winning its second NCAA Division I women's golf title in five years May 24-27 at Sun River, Oregon. Oregon State served as the tournament's host institution.

The Wildcats' four-round total of 23-over 1,175 gave them a 21-stroke victory, the third widest margin in the tournament's 19-year history.

Arizona's Jenna Daniels won the individual title, shooting a 5-over 77 in stormy final round conditions for a 1-under 287 total. Teammate Julia Kraschinski shot an 80 in the final round to finish second at 290, and Wake Forest's Marta Prieto was third at 292. Danielle Downey of Auburn was fourth with a 292 total and Stanford's Stephanie Keever and Southern California's Leila Chartrand posted 295 totals to tie for fifth.

Texas finished third at 1,198; Southern California was fourth at 1,199 and Tennessee placed fifth at 1,206.

Highlights

Mocs Take First Division II Title: Florida Southern, led by senior Lisa Cave, claimed the inaugural Division II Women's Golf Championship, besting runner-up Rollins by seven strokes. The Moccasins, who won their first national championship, trailed Rollins by nine shots heading into the final round, but posted a tournament-low 303 on the last day to snatch the title. The tournament was played at Texas Star Golf Course in Euless, Texas, May 16-19.

Cave nabbed her second-straight championship, coming from 10 strokes behind on the final day to win medalist honors. The senior fired a one-over par 72 in the final round, catching Rollins' Lyndsey Devenish, who had the lead following the third round. Devenish and teammate Jennifer Beames tied for second with a 312 total.

Florida Southern's decisive final round included Cave's 72, a 76 from Lisa Ball, a 77 from Norie Nakagawa and a 78 from Teri Goolsby.

The Mocs posted a tournament total of 1,259 to edge Rollins' score of 1,266. Northeastern State was third with a 1,330 total. Western New Mexico (1,337) and Minnesota State-Mankato (1,374) rounded out the top five.

Highlights

Familiar Team Wins First-Ever Division III Title: The first Division III Women's Golf Championship was awarded to an experienced winner — Methodist. The Monarchs, winners of three of the four combined Divisions II/III championships, posted a 51-stroke win over Concordia-Moorhead. It was the largest margin of victory in any division of the women's golf championships.

Methodist and Concordia-Moorhead were followed by Rhodes (1,356), Simpson (1,364) and Southwestern (Texas) (1,398). The tournament was played May 16-19 at Prairie Vista Golf Course in Bloomington, Illinois. Host institution Illinois Wesleyan finished sixth with a 1,433 total.

Stacey Smith led the Monarchs' charge, firing a four-round total of 316 to edge teammate Melanie Tipps (319) for the individual title. Two individual qualifiers placed third behind Methodist's top two golfers. Luther's Caroline Hellmark and Patricia Kuehner of Franklin posted scores of 321. Emily Burch of third-place Rhodes took fifth place with a 323 total.
