

UC Santa Barbara 5, (No. 3) Miami, Fla. 3 – Attendance 15,748 (MCWS Total: 101,949; Avg. 20,390) – Time of Game: 2:26

UC Santa Barbara advances to play loser of Arizona/Oklahoma State Wednesday at 6 p.m. (CT). Miami (Fla.) has been eliminated from the College World Series with a 0-2 record

## No. 3 Miami, Fla. (50-14):

- The Hurricanes (No. 3 National Seed) advanced to their 25th College World Series in program history ... Its 25 trips to Omaha are second-most behind Texas (35) ... They won the national championships in 1982, 1985, 1999 and 2001, which are the fifth-most by any school ...
- UM has never missed the CWS when earning a national seed: 1999, 2001, 2003, 2004, 2008, 2015 and 2016 ...
- Miami's back-to-back CWS trips are its first since 2003-04 ...
- The Canes posted back-to-back 50-win seasons for the first time since 1996-99 (four seasons) ... In 2016, Miami is 7-4 in the postseason: 2-1 in the ACC Tournament, 3-0 in the Coral Gables Regional, 2-1 in the Coral Gables Super Regional and 0-2 in CWS ...
- With Miami's qualification to the CWS, the ACC has had a team reach Omaha in 11 consecutive years ...
- The Hurricanes are participating in their NCAA record 44th-straight postseason ... Miami's 48 wins in Omaha
  and 89 total College World Series games played are fourth-most by a program in history ... Since winning their
  last title in 2001, the Hurricanes are just 5-12 in Omaha and have finished fifth five times and seventh once ...
- Jim Morris owns a 1,535-663-4 career record (Division I) in 34 years ... He is one of four coaches with 1,500-plus wins at the Division I level (Augie Garrido/Texas/1,975; Mike Martin/Florida State/1,898; Mark Marquess/Stanford/1,585 and Morris) ... Morris owns a 22-21 all-time record in 13 appearances in the CWS ...
- Miami has hit nine home runs in the NCAA Tournament, second most of any team and the most of any school to reach the CWS ... Two of its nine home runs have been grand slams, which ironically were its only two hits this postseason with the bases loaded ...
- UM has gone winless just twice in 25 CWS appearances (1979 and 2016) ... They lost to Arizona in the opener both times and were eliminated by programs from the state of California (Pepperdine/1979 and UCSB/2016) – 21 CWS appearances between 0-2 outings ...
- Miami scored in the first inning on Zack Collins' solo home run and are now 33-3 when scoring first ...
- Zack Collins drove in a pair of runs on two hits ... Smacked his 16th home run of the season and 42nd of his career (tied for sixth on UM's all-time list with Danny Matienzo) in the top of the first inning to RCF ... Collins ranks third on the NCAA active career leaders in home runs (42) and RBI (183) ... Drew a pair of walks (fourth and sixth innings) on the day and has three in the CWS pushing season total to 78, which leads the nation and ranks second on school's single-season list behind Pat Burrell (83 in 1997) ... Tallied his 24th multi-hit and 15 multi-RBI games of the year ...
- Johnny Ruiz' infield single to third in the fourth inning extended his on-base streak to 14 games ... He added a walk in the sixth inning (38th of the season) ...
- Randy Batista drove in his fourth run of the NCAA Tournament with an RBI single to center in the eighth inning
   ... He has three hits in this CWS (2 vs. Arizona, 1 vs. UCSB) ...
- Jacob Heyward extended his hit streak to six games with a single in the sixth and has reached base in 10straight games ... Tallied three hits in this CWS ...
- Danny Garcia (9-5) had his shortest outing of the NCAA Tournament going 5.1 innings where he allowed three
  runs (all earned) on five hits ... At one point, before rain delay, had retired 10-straight from the second inning
  (when he loaded the bases) until giving up a leadoff single to Devon Gradford in the sixth ...
- Miami had seven hits in the game with four coming in the eighth inning (all in a row) ... Had just two hits through seven innings ...



## UC Santa Barbara (43-19-1):

- UCSB moved to 13-22 all-time in the postseason, and 6-1 this year ...
- UCSB is the fourth different team from the University of California system to qualify for the College World Series, joining UCLA, California and UC Irvine ... UCSB is the third different Big West Conference representative in the last three years, joining UC Irvine (2014) and Cal State Fullerton (2015) ...
- The last win by a Big West team was in 2014 ... UC Irvine defeated Texas, 3-1, on June 14 ...
- The Gauchos will face either Arizona or Oklahoma State at 6:00 pm on Wednesday, June 22 ...
- UCSB is 28-2 with the lead after six innings ...
- The Gauchos are 30-2 when scoring at least five runs ...
- UCSB scored its first run at the CWS in the first inning today ...
- The Gauchos have only scored in three of the past 30 innings ... Twice plating four runs in a frame (Ninth inning on June 12, sixth inning today) ...
- During the NCAA Tournament UCSB pinch-hitters are 3-for-6 with six RBI and two runs scored ...
- Over the last three NCAA Tournament games, UCSB pinch-hitters have accounted for six RBI ... The rest of the team has driven in three ...
- Kyle Nelson line entering the game the NCAA's: 8.0 IP, 1 H, 6 BB, 12 SO (0-0, 0.00 ERA, 1 save) Today: 3.0 IP, 5 H, 1 BB, 2 R, 2 ER, 2 SO to earn the save ...
- Prior to the double by Michelangeli, Nelson had gone 20.1 innings between extra-base hits allowed ...
- Clay Fisher, Andrew Calica and JJ Muno have each started all 63 games this season for the Gauchos ...
- JJ Muno's first-inning single extended his hit streak to seven ... He has reached base in 14 straight games ...
- Noah Davis has started the second game for the Gauchos in each round of the NCAA Tournament. He entered today with a 5.56 ERA (7 ER in 11.1 innings), held Miami to one run on two hits over six innings ...



## 2016 College World Series Notes

#### **Runs Notes:**

- With OSU's 1-0 win over UC Santa Barbara, it is the fourth-straight year with a 1-0 game in the CWS ... There were no 1-0 games in Omaha from 1986-2012 (27 years) ... Last 1-0 game to open a CWS was in 1985 (Arkansas 1, South Carolina 0) ... There have been three 1-0 games to open a CWS (Wake Forest 1, Colgate 0/1955; Minnesota 1, Oklahoma 0/1973; Arkansas 1, South Carolina 0/1985) ... This is the 20th 1-0 decision in CWS history ...
- Miami allowed four of the CWS' five runs in the first inning this year (3 vs. Arizona, 1 vs. USCB) ...
- Of the last 46 teams to score five or more runs at the CWS, 44 of them have won (Virginia lost 10-5 to Florida/2015, Virginia lost 9-8 to Vanderbilt/ 2014) since 2010 at Rosenblatt ... Since the CWS moved to TD Ameritrade Park, teams that score at least 5 runs are 39-2 (.951) ...
- In this year's CWS, 21 of the 26 runs scored (80.8%) have been driven in via a hit ...
- In other words, 5 of the 26 runs (19.2%) have scored as a result of something other than a hit ...
- Actual scoring breakdown: hits (21), sac bunt (2), error (1), sac fly (1) and walk (1) ...
- Inning breakdown of runs scored: first (5), second (0), third (2), fourth (4), fifth (5), sixth (4), seventh (0), eighth (3) and ninth (3) ...

#### **Hit Notes:**

- Coastal Carolina's first five hits of the game (vs. Florida/Game 4) went for extra bases (3 doubles, 2 triples)
  marking the first time at the CWS in TDAPO that a team's first five base knocks were for extra bases ...
- Hits breakdown: singles (41), doubles (16), triples (2) and home runs (2) ...

### **Home Run Notes:**

- Through five games of the CWS, we have had three home runs (Cam Warner/TCU/Game 3; Luken Baker/TCU/Game 3; Zack Collins/Miami/Game 5) ...
- Luken Baker's (TCU) three-run homer in the top of the ninth is just the second homer in the 9th inning (or later) in the CWS at TDAPO (other was Jeren Kendall from Vanderbilt in 2015 – walk-off) ...
- The total number of home runs at TDAPO is 43 (80 CWS game in park history) ... CWS home run chart at TDAPO including Sunday: LF/18, LCF/5, CF/3, RCF/2 and RF/15) ... In all games played at TDAPO, there have been 115 home runs ...

### **Pitching Notes**

- Game 1 between Oklahoma State and UC Santa Barbara was the first CWS game with both starting pitchers throwing a complete game since June 19, 2013 ... Oregon State's Matt Boyd and Indiana's Aaron Siegers did it
- Andrew Beckwith (Coastal Carolina/Game 4) is the third pitcher in this year's CWS to toss a complete game (others: Thomas Hatch/Oklahoma State and Shane Bieber/UC Santa Barbara – both in Game 1) ... There was only one complete thrown in the 2014 CWS and 2015 CWS ...

### **Shutout Notes:**

 With Thomas Hatch's (Oklahoma State) complete game shutout in Game 1 vs. UC Santa Barbara, it was the 82nd CG SHO in CWS History and first since Matt Boyd (Oregon State) on 2013 vs. Indiana on 6/19/13 which is a 1-0 contest ...

## **Taking The Lead Notes:**

- Teams leading after eight innings have won 85 of the last 87 CWS games (Vanderbilt overcame a 3-1 deficit to defeat Cal State Fullerton 4-3 in Game 4 of 2015; TCU scored three runs in top of ninth to beat Texas Tech in Game 3 of 2016) ...
- Teams leading after eight innings at TD Ameritrade Park Omaha are 221-8 all-time at TDAPO in 229 games ...



### **Miscellaneous Notes**

- First official review in CWS history (started in 2012) came in top of the third inning of Game 4 in the 2016 CWS between Coastal Carolina and Florida ... The call was four minutes and six seconds (4:06) and was overturned on the field in favor of Coastal Carolina ... Original call was a foul ball down the right field line overturned for an RBI double ...
- National Seeds are 0-4 in the 2016 CWS (No. 3 Miami/0-2/eliminated; No. 5 Texas Tech loss in Game 3; No. 1
  Florida loss to Coastal Carolina/2-1 in Game 4) ... It is just the second time in 18 years since the NCAA
  Tournament expanded in 1999, no national teams won their opening game at the CWS (2013: LSU, North
  Carolina and Oregon State) ... Only two of the last 12 national champions have been national seeds (LSU/2009
  and South Carolina/2011) ...
- Florida, who is making its 10th CWS appearance, is searching for its first national title ... Only four teams that
  have made 10 CWS appearances have not won a championship (Florida State/21, Clemson/12, North
  Carolina/10, Northern Colorado/10) ...
- For the first time since 2012, the CWS had more than one team in the field make its first CWS appearance with Coastal Carolina and UC Santa Barbara ... In 2012, it was Kent State (1-2) and Stony Brook (0-2) ...
- Since 2007, nine teams made the CWS debut posting 2-8 record in opening games (10-17 overall) ...
- Oklahoma State is one of three Big 12 teams in this year's CWS (Texas Tech and TCU) ... Last time a
  conference had multiple bids with each team reaching Omaha was the Big 8 in 1993 (Kansas and Oklahoma
  State) ... Last time a conference has three or more bids with each team making the CWS was the SEC in 1990
  (Georgia, LSU and Mississippi State) ...
- Josh Holliday (Oklahoma State), Jay Johnson (Arizona) and Gary Gillmore (Coastal Carolina) picked their first career wins in the CWS ... The last head coach to win his CWS debut was Elliot Avent (NC State) on June 16, 2013 ...
- Saturday's meeting (Game 2) between Arizona and Miami (Fla.) was the first in Omaha between programs with 38-plus CWS wins since 2009, when Arizona State faced Texas twice ...
- June 13, 1955 was the last time that Oklahoma State and Arizona both won CWS games on the same day ...
- Saturday marked the first time two head coaches (Josh Holliday and Jay Johnson) won their CWS debut on the same day since June 19, 2010, when Jim Schlossnagle (TCU) and John Savage (UCLA) both won, also on the Opening Day of the CWS ...
- The Big 12 is 17-4 in the NCAA Tournament after today's result, including a 2-1 mark in the 2016 CWS ... Those
  17 victories have come against teams from 12 different leagues (including today's win over the Big 12) ... The
  Big 12 is the only conference with a different regular-season and postseason champion both in Omaha (Texas
  Tech and TCU) ...
- Jim Schlossnagle (TCU) and Tim Tadlock (Texas Tech) are the only coaches in Big 12 history to guide their squads to the CWS twice in their first four years coaching in the conference ...
- For the first time since 2005, the Atlantic Coast Conference failed to advance a team past its first two games ...
- Teams to score first are now 3-2 in the 2016 CWS ... Visiting teams are 3-2 so far this year ...
- Game 5 had a 62-minute rain delay ... Last weather delay in CWS was Vanderbilt vs. Cal State Fullerton (June 14 & 15, 2015) ... Delay lasted 1:19 with Cal State leading 3-0 in the bottom of the sixth inning – later suspended until next day) ...
