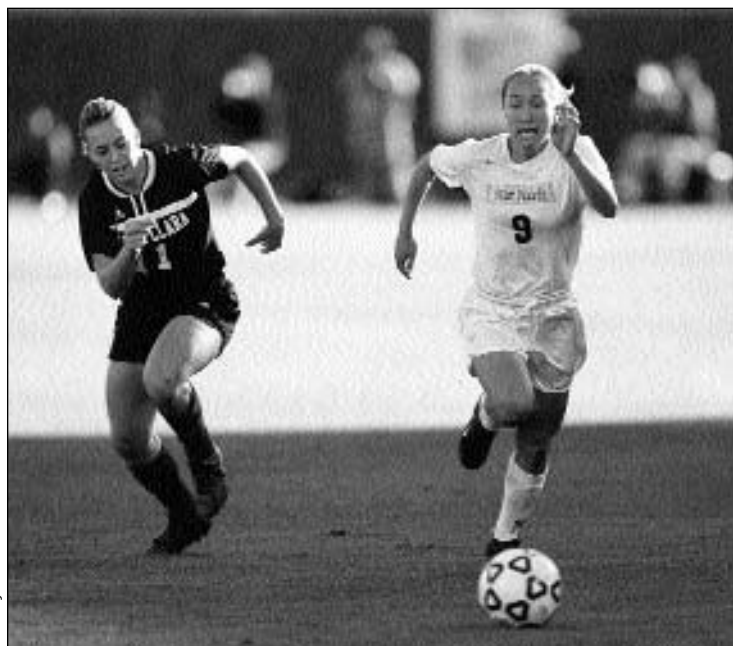

Highlights

Broncos Snap Tar Heels' Streak: Santa Clara won its first championship December 9 at Southern Methodist on a late first-half goal, denying North Carolina a 17th title.

The second-ranked Broncos gave North Carolina its first loss of the season and broke Tar Heels' 11-game tournament winning streak and 34-game overall win streak.

North Carolina, which has advanced to all 20 semifinals, hadn't lost a tournament game since the 1998 championship contest against Florida.
