The Big Six Conference was founded in 1928 when charter members left the MVIAA. Iowa St., Kansas, Kansas St., Missouri, Nebraska and Oklahoma were joined by Colorado (1948) (conference then known as Big Seven) and Oklahoma St. (1958) (conference then known as Big Eight until 1996). All eight members of the Big Eight joined four former Southwest Conference members (Baylor, Texas, Texas A&M and Texas Tech) to form the Big 12 Conference in 1996.

A split took place in 1938, when the Mountain States Athletic Conference or "Big Seven" was formed. The name Rocky Mountain Conference was retained by the last six schools after 1938. Some members went into the Western Athletic Conference when the RMC was dissolved in 1962.
