# NATIONALLY PROMINENT TEAMS THAT PERMANENTLY DROPPED FOOTBALL

Listed alphabetically are the all-time records of teams formerly classified as major college that permanently discontinued football. Also included are those teams that, retroactively, are considered to have been major college (before the advent of official classification in 1937) by virtue of their schedules (that is, at least half of their games versus other major-college opponents). All schools listed were considered to have been major college or classified in either the FBS or FCS for a minimum of 10 consecutive seasons. Ties are computed as half a win and half a loss.
