# Three bowl games were included in the home games attendance. They are the Hawaii Bowl played in Honolulu with an attendance of 43,678 is included in the Hawaii home attendance, the Armed Forces Bowl played in Dallas with an attendance of 36,742 is included in the SMU home attendance, and the Poinsettia Bowl played in San Diego with an attendance of 48,049 is included in the San Diego State home attendance. If you include these three bowl games with the others, the bowl totals are 35 bowls with a 1,813,215 total attendance for a 51,806 average per game.

CHAMPIONSHIP TOURNAMENTS: The total attendance for the Division I FCS Tournament was 178,914 for a 9,417 average over 19 games, the Division II Tournament was 101,987 for a 4,434 average over 23 games and the Division III Tournament was 59,623 for a 1,923 average over 31 games.
