2007 Title Game Summary

Appalachian State Wins Third Consecutive Football Championship: Everywhere Appalachian State football coach Jerry Moore went during the summer of 2007 in Boone, North Carolina, people would greet him with a three-finger wave.

The symbol, which looks similar to the traditional "okay" sign, represented the community's expectation of the Mountaineers repeating as NCAA titlist in the Football Championship Subdivision. It did not seem to matter to the Appalachian State fans that their thirst for a third straight national championship at this level of football had never been accomplished before.

After Appalachian State pulled off a stunning upset of then-fifth-ranked Michigan in front of 100,000-plus fans in Ann Arbor September 1, the pressure to win another FCS crown only intensified.

The Mountaineers fulfilled that goal by grabbing a convincing 49-21 win over Delaware in the FCS title game December 14. A standing-room-only record crowd of 23,010 packed Chattanooga's Finley Stadium to witness history. Thousands of those in attendance ended up on the field to celebrate with the team for a third consecutive year.

"I can't tell you what a relief it is being able to three-peat," said Moore, whose team overcame injuries, two regular-season losses and two close calls in the playoffs to finish 13-2. "It is over. About midway through the season, I wasn't so sure what they were going to do with all those fingers. It's been a great run with a bunch of great kids."

Appalachian State's black-and-gold-clad fan base composed most of the crowd, and the atmosphere in the stadium remained festive throughout as the Mountaineers showed why they are the standard to which all others are compared at the FCS level.

Sophomore quarterback Armanti Edwards threw for three touchdowns and senior tailback Kevin Richardson capped a stellar career by scoring three times -- twice on receptions -- to lead the Appalachian State offense. The Mountaineers amassed 556 yards of total offense.

Edwards, the catalyst to Appalachian State's spread offense, began the season by dazzling college football fans with his passing and running abilities against Michigan. Those same skills were on display in the FCS championship game.

After forcing the Blue Hens (11-4) to punt after three plays on the game's opening possession, the Mountaineers marched 58 yards in six plays to take a 7-0 lead. Edwards and Richardson capped the drive by connecting on a 19-yard screen pass for the score.

The pivotal sequence of the game began on Delaware's next possession. The Blue Hens drove 70 yards and appeared to have tied the score when Omar Cuff was tackled near the goal line on second-and-goal from the 4. The on-field officials ruled it a touchdown, but the play was overturned by the replay official after seeing that Cuff's elbow hit the ground just before he broke the plane of the goal line.

Cuff was stuffed at the 1-yard line on third down, and senior quarterback Joe Flacco threw an incomplete pass on fourth down. Delaware coach K.C. Keeler decided against a chip-shot field-goal attempt, because he figured field goals wouldn't be enough to beat Appalachian State.

"We had to go by sevens, because their offense was as good as advertised," Keeler said.

The Mountaineers used the momentum and drove 99 yards in a minute and 26 seconds to make the score 14-0. It only took five plays plus a 15-yard facemask penalty for Appalachian State to score. Reserve running back Devon Moore ended the quick-strike drive by going untouched up the middle on a 46-yard touchdown run.

Murphy's Law kept tapping Delaware on the shoulder as it fell behind, 21-0, despite making Richardson fumble near the goal line. Appalachian State freshman tight end Daniel Kilgore recovered the ball in the end zone. The Blue Hens, who gained 432 yards, managed to cut the deficit to 14 points after Flacco threw a 39-yard scoring pass to Mark Duncan with 1:10 left in the first half.

Any momentum gained was quickly taken away by Appalachian State 21 seconds later. Edwards drove the Mountaineers 72 yards in two plays by completing two passes, the second of which was a 60-yard score to Dexter Jackson.

"We had to be disciplined and some of our miscues cost us," said Delaware defensive lineman Jeremy Kametz, whose team trailed, 28-7, at halftime. "Their offense was speedy."

In the second half, the Mountaineers increased their advantage after Richardson caught an eight-yard scoring pass from Edwards.

Cuff cut the lead to 35-14 by scoring on a 1-yard run with 54 seconds remaining in the third quarter. It was Cuff's FCS-record 39th touchdown of the season.

That was as close as the Blue Hens, who defeated top-seeded Northern Iowa, 37-29, and fourth-seeded Southern Illinois, 20-17, on the road just to reach the finals, would climb to Appalachian State the rest of the way.

All during the season, Moore and his student-athletes told everyone who would listen that winning the FCS title was more important to them than beating Michigan.

"Beating Michigan didn't put a ring on my finger," said Edwards, who was 49-of-71 passing for 722 yards with seven touchdowns and no interceptions in four postseason games. He also scored eight rushing TDs while producing 1,382 yards of total offense in the playoffs.

Appalachian State almost didn't make it to the title after escaping with a 28-27 win over James Madison in the first round when a fumble inside its 10-yard line in the final seconds kept the Mountaineers' season alive. In the second round, Appalachian State edged Eastern Washington, 38-35.

"I hadn't cried in years, but I cried," said Appalachian State senior left guard Kerry Brown. "It's a great way to go out."

Moore has been an assistant coach at Nebraska and Arkansas, but the phenomenon Appalachian State has grown into tops anything he has experienced in his coaching career.

"Those are institutions with renowned football programs," Moore said. "But in the years I was at those places, I don't think we ever got the national attention as our football team has at Appalachian State. I am thrilled for these players. Our seniors have three national championships."

Now, Appalachian State fans will have to develop a four-fingered wave to inspire Moore and his team for 2008.

NCAA Division I Football Championship History

1978 At the 72nd NCAA Convention (January 1978) in Atlanta, Ga., the membership voted to establish the Division I-AA Football Championship and a statistics program for the division. The format for the first I-AA championship, held in Wichita Falls, Texas, was a single-elimination, four-team tournament. Florida A&M defeated Massachusetts, 35-28, in the title game. The game was televised by ABC.

1981 The championship expanded to include eight teams in a single-elimination tournament.

1982 The championship expanded to include 12 teams. Eight teams played first-round games at campus sites, and the top four teams, seeded by the Division I-AA Football Committee, received byes.

1986 The championship field expanded to its current format of 16 teams with each team playing a first-round game.

1987 Louisiana-Monroe defeated Marshall, 43-42, in the closest game in championship history.

1989 A then-record 25,725 fans watched Georgia Southern down Stephen F. Austin, 37-34, in the championship game at Allen E. Paulson Stadium in Statesboro, Ga.

1990 Georgia Southern won its fourth I-AA championship, adding to its titles in 1985, 1986 and 1989.

1991 Youngstown State won its first national championship with a 25-17 victory over Marshall. Penguin head coach Jim Tressel joined his father, Lee, as the only father-son combination to win NCAA football titles. Lee Tressel won the 1978 Division III championship at Baldwin-Wallace.

1992 A then-record crowd of 31,304 in Huntington, W.Va., saw Marshall return the favor with a 31-28 win over Youngstown State for its first I-AA title.

1993 The I-AA championship provided for a maximum field of 16 teams. Six member conferences (Big Sky, Gateway, Ohio Valley, Southern, Southland and Yankee) were granted automatic qualification for their respective winners. Youngstown State won its second I-AA title with a 17-5 victory over Marshall before a crowd of 29,218 in Huntington, W.Va.

1994 Youngstown State won its third national title in four years with a 28-14 victory over Boise State.

1995 Montana won its first Division I-AA title before a championship record crowd of 32,106 in Huntington, W.Va.

1996 Marshall, making its fifth visit to the championship game since 1991, won its second Division I-AA title with a 49-29 victory over defending champion Montana before 30,052 in Huntington, W.Va.

1997 Youngstown State won its fourth national title in the 1990s with a 10-9 victory over McNeese State in Chattanooga, Tenn.

1999 Georgia Southern closed out the century with another national title, posting a 59-24 victory over Youngstown State. The Eagles won their fifth title, surpassing Youngstown State's four championships and taking over the division lead in crowns.

2000 Georgia Southern rallied past Montana, 27-25, to claim back-to-back titles for the third time in its Division I-AA history.

2001 Montana won a defensive duel with Furman, 13-6, to claim its second title.

2002 Western Kentucky won its first Division I-AA championship with a 34-14 victory over McNeese State, which lost in the final for the second time (1997 in 10-9 loss to Youngstown State). Coach Jack Harbaugh, father of former Chicago Bears' and Indianapolis Colts' quarterback Jim Harbaugh, won his first NCAA title.

2003 Delaware won its first NCAA crown since winning the 1979 Division II championship. The Blue Hens outscored their opponents by a combined margin of 149-23 and posted the first championship-game shutout with a 40-0 blanking of previously unbeaten Colgate. It was the first NCAA title for head coach and former Delaware linebacker K.C. Keeler, who had five second-place finishes at Division III Rowan.

2004 James Madison was the second straight champion to come out of the Atlantic 10 Conference after defeating Montana, 31-21. The 2003 champion was Delaware. The Dukes also made history on its way to the championship game, becoming the first team to advance to the title contest with three straight wins on the road. James Madison won preliminary-round games at Lehigh, Furman and William and Mary.

2005 Appalachian State made its championship number eight for the Southern Conference as the Mountaineers rallied from a 16-7 halftime deficit to defeat the University of Northern Iowa, 21-16. The two teams played in front of a crowd of 19,219.

2006 Division I-AA is now known as the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) and Division I-A is now the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS). Since the NCAA does not sponsor a championship for the FBS, the tournament to determine an FCS winner is now called the Division I Football Championship. Appalachian State became the first repeat champion since Georgia Southern in 1999 and 2000. The Mountaineers scored two fourth-quarter touchdowns to break a 14-14 tie and take a 28-17 victory over Massachusetts in front of a crowd of 22,808, the highest attendance in the championship's 10-year run in Chattanooga.

2007 Appalachian State becomes the first team to win three straight Division I football championships with a 49-21 win over Delaware in the title game. The attendance of 23,010 is the highest since the championship moved to Chattanooga.
