- A Women's Frozen Four is held for the first time as Minn. Duluth defeats St. Lawrence, 4-2, in Minneapolis to take
- Minn. Duluth wins its second straight Women's Frozen Four, 3-2, over Brown.
- 2003 Minn. Duluth wins the Women's Frozen Four, its third consecutive, in front of a record crowd of 5,167, in its home
- Minnesota outscores its two opponents, 11-3, to dominate the Women's Frozen Four in Providence, Rhode Island. 2004 The Golden Gophers beat Harvard, 6-2, in the championship game.
- The field expands to eight teams with Mercyhurst, Providence and Wisconsin all making their first appearances. 2005 Minnesota wins its second straight title.
- 2006 Wisconsin claims its first Women's Frozen Four title in Minneapolis after defeating Minnesota, the two-time defending national champion. The Badgers become the first team in tournament history other than the Golden Gophers or Minn. Duluth to win the championship




