

Highlights

Lynn trumps Nova Southeastern in final round to earn first title since 1997: With a team score of 1,187, Lynn defeated four-time defending champion Nova Southeastern May 15 to 18 in the 2013 NCAA Division II Women's Golf Championships at LPGA International's Legends Course in Daytona Beach, Fla. The title is Lynn's first since 1997. At that time, Division II and Division III teams competed in a combined championship.

It wasn't easy for Lynn, which was neck and neck with Nova Southeastern the entire final day. The two teams exchanged the lead many times throughout the round, but when it mattered most, the Fighting Knights stayed calm.

"I knew we were in the lead coming into 18," Lynn head coach Danny Randolph said. "I knew we played solid and that they had made a couple of mistakes. I felt pretty good; I just wanted to get the ball in the hole."

The two teams were deadlocked through the 15th hole. Then, in the final three holes, Lynn pulled away for a three-shot victory. It was the second time in a month that Lynn defeated Nova Southeastern. The first was at the South Regional May 5.

"That's the beauty of being in the Sunshine State Conference," Randolph said. "You don't have to go anywhere to know where your best teams are. We knew they were right down the road from us."

"We obviously played in all these tournaments together and it was very much a comfort factor. We aren't intimidated by them in a respectful way. I respect Nova Southeastern for what they've done over the last four years."

We knew we had our hands full and that's what I told the girls. They're the champs right now and they don't have to be the champs at the end of the day."

The top three teams in the championships, Lynn, Nova Southeastern and Barry, are in the same conference.

"We have a very, very competitive conference," Lynn junior Ellen Chambers said. "We bring out the best in each other. It's great going to tournaments because every time we're playing against the best teams in the country and that really motivates us, and it definitely did this week playing with Nova and Barry in the final two rounds."

Chambers led the Knights with a fourth-round 75. She finished the tournament with a 7-over 295, good for fourth place in the individual results.

"Ellen was honestly our best player for much of the year," Randolph said. "She struggled a little the last couple of weeks. We have two keys, communication and depth. It can be anybody any day who helps us."

The top team not from the Sunshine State Conference was St. Edward's in fourth place. Grand Canyon rounded out the top five.

Nancy Vergara became Barry's first individual champion, edging Nova Southeastern's Linnea Johansson by one shot. Vergara finished with a 3-over-par 291.
