Highlights

Make it Duke: Led by Virada Nirapathpongorn, a sophomore from Thailand, Duke shot a 12-under 1,164 total and captured the title May 24 at Washington. Nirapathpongorn won the individual competition, closing with an even-par 72 for a five-stroke victory. Nirapathpongorn's 279 equaled the championship record established by Southern California's Jennifer Rosales in 1998.

Arizona's Lorena Ochoa shot a final-round 73 to tie for second with Auburn's Danielle Downey, Georgia's Summer Sirmons and Lindsey Wright of Pepperdine.

Duke's team title was completed with a one-under-par final round. The Blue Devils won by six strokes over Arizona, Auburn and Texas. Georgia, which beat Duke by three strokes last year, finished fifth.
