Highlights

Only Fitting: Since Princeton had been the last team not named Maryland to win a championship (1994), it was only fitting that the Tigers, who were visiting the title game for the third time since then, walked away with the trophy after a 12-7 win over top-seeded Georgetown May 19.

Lauren Simone, who was voted the tournament's most outstanding player, led the way for the victors, scoring two of her three goals in the second half to help Princeton post its school-record 19th straight win, the only loss coming in the season opener against the Hoyas, 15-13.

All-Tournament Team: Simone was joined on the all-tournament team by teammates Sarah Kolodner, Whitney Miller, Brooke Owens and Rachael Becker. The Hoyas' representatives were Melissa Biles, Chandler Vicchio and Erin Elbe. Also named were Cornell's Jaimee Reynolds and Katie McCorry. North Carolina's Jazmine Norton and Beth Ames also were selected.

The last team other than Maryland or Princeton to win the championship was Virginia, in 1993, which beat the Tigers in the title game. The Terps were eliminated by Cornell, 14-4, in the quarterfinals.

It's Official: West Chester won its first true Division II championship after being the Division II representative in the National Collegiate Championship two other times. In the previous year, the first of a true Division II championship, West Chester had the opportunity to grab the NCAA trophy but fell to C.W. Post in the championship game, 13-9.

This time the Rams seized their chance to be golden with an 11-6 win over Stonehill May 12 in front of a West Chester crowd.

The title is the Golden Rams' first NCAA women's team championship and its first NCAA team championship in any sport since 1961, when the school's men's soccer team took the Division I trophy. The last time West Chester won any version of a national championship was 1979, when women's lacrosse won the United States Women's Intercollegiate Lacrosse Coaches Association crown.
