## Highlights

**Southern California men win fourth title in a row; rally to victory through rain delay, early deficit:** Southern California won its fourth consecutive NCAA Division I team championship in dramatic fashion May 22 in Athens, Ga. The Trojans fought through rain delays, venue changes at Georgia's Dan Magill Tennis Complex and tense matches to defeat Virginia, 4-2.

The showdown was a rematch of the 2011 national championship, this time with Southern California as the top seed and Virginia at No. 3. After the match was moved indoors with Southern California trailing, 1-0, the Trojans captured four of the five singles matches completed to finish the 2012 season with a 33-1 record. It was also the fourth national title for head coach Peter Smith.

Virginia captured the doubles point after shifting the momentum on courts two and three. The Trojans had gone up a break on both courts before the Cavaliers managed to rally back almost simultaneously to turn things in their favor. At the No. 2 spot, Southern California's Daniel Nguyen and Ray Sarmiento took their first loss of the season with an 8-5 defeat to Alex Domijan and Mitchell Frank. Shortly after, Emilio Gomez and Yannick Hanfmann fell, 8-4, to Justin Shane and Julen Uriguen, and Virginia took the lead.

The Trojans rallied, however, and the clinching points came on the shoulders of two freshmen. Hanfmann would be one of the heroes of the day, shrugging off a rough second set and battling back in the third to win in a tiebreaker.

After a two-and-a-half-hour break to dry the courts, the rains returned and pushed the competition indoors, where both teams had wrapped up their semifinals about 20 hours earlier. Playing side by side for the first time because of the unique setup, Steve Johnson and Gomez had their respective No. 1 and No. 4 matches next to one another.

The two Trojans seemed to feed off each other's energy, as Johnson picked up the pace against Jarmere Jenkins and registered the tying win with a 6-3, 6-2 decision. Gomez wasn't far behind, outplaying Drew Courtney to the tune of a 6-4, 6-2 win that bumped the Trojans ahead.

At the No. 3 spot, however, Virginia had the advantage with Mitchell Frank facing Nguyen for the third time this season. Frank had captured the previous two meetings, and was strong once again in a 6-3, 6-2 decision that knotted the team score.

Hanfmann and fellow freshman Roberto Quiroz both were getting started in their respective matches with courts that opened up for action. Meanwhile at No. 2, Sarmiento was seeing the finish line. His serve was broken to extend the second set, but he recovered to win the next two games and close out his 6-4, 7-5 victory over Domijan.

That left the championship on the shoulders of Hanfmann and Quiroz. In the sixth singles match, Quiroz lost the first set but won a second-set tiebreaker to stay alive. Hanfmann, however, sealed the deal as he broke back against Uriguen to force the deciding third-set tiebreaker and extended the Trojans' championship streak with the 6-4, 2-6, 7-6(3) clincher.

Johnson repeated as individual champion, defeating Kentucky's Eric Quigley in straight sets, 6-4, 6-4.

In the doubles competition, Ohio State's Chase Buchanan and Blaz Rola defeated Texas Tech's Raony Carvalho and Conzalo Escobar, 7-6(4), 6-3.
