Highlights

Emory completes perfect season with third national title: Emory earned the program's third team title May 23 as it rallied for a victory against Kenyon in the title match of the 2012 Division III Men's Tennis Championships.

The 5-3 decision against the Lords closed the Eagles' season at 25-0 while Kenyon finished at 24-5.

Emory dropped the first two points of the match as the Lords' Nos. 1 and 2 doubles teams each came away with 8-6 victories. The Eagles then perhaps had their season saved when the No. 3 tandem of senior Dillon Pottish and freshman Brian Kowalski scrapped to a 9-8 outcome over Paul Burgin and Kevin Ye, rallying from a 4-6 deficit in the tie-breaker by winning the next four points. The outcome raised their spring mark to an unblemished 15-0.

Buoyed by the inspired play of Pottish and Kowalski, Emory tied the match when freshman Ian Wagner registered an impressive 6-1, 6-4 decision against C.J. Williams at No. 3 singles, his 21st victory in 24 decisions in the spring. However, the Lords regained the lead after the conclusion of No. 2 singles when Michael Razumovsky topped Chris Goodwin in consecutive sets.

Freshman Alex Ruderman knotted the contest at 3-3 after carving out a decisive 6-1, 6-3 victory against Ye at sixth singles, upping his spring record to 20-1.

A little more than three and one-half hours into the match, the Eagles took their first lead when Kowalski notched a 6-3, 2-6, 6-1 verdict against Wade Heerboth. With Pottish in the third set of his battle against Burgin at No. 1 singles and freshman Eric Halpern going up against Tim Rosensteel at No. 5, it was Halpern who sealed the deal for the Eagles, assuring that the championship trophy would be heading back to Atlanta, with a 7-5, 7-5 win, his 20th in 22 outings.

The team's final ledger of 25-0 marked the first time an Emory team had compiled a perfect record. The 2012 squad joins the 2003 and 2006 Emory championship teams, all under the watch of 13-year head coach John Browning.

In individual competition, Emory's Pottish defeated Cal Lutheran's Nicholas Ballou, 6-2, 1-6, 6-2 for the school's third singles title in the last four years. In the doubles final, Amherst's Luis Rattenhuber and Austin Chafetz bounced back from losing the first set to Gustavus Adolphus' Amrik Donkena and Mya Smith-Dennis for a 4-6, 7-5, 6-3 victory.
