Highlights

Williams builds to NCAA title: What began as a far-fetched dream four years ago became reality May 22 as Williams defeated Claremont-Mudd-Scripps, 5-2, to claim the NCAA Division III championship at the Markin Center, Kalamazoo's indoor tennis facility.

That dream took an apparent detour through California earlier this season when Williams lost at Claremont-Mudd-Scripps, 5-4, and then lost to New England Small College Athletic Conference rival Amherst by the same score a week later. Those losses actually put the dream back on track.

"We travel to California every year and we lost to CMS, 5-4, and then we lost to Amherst, too, but we used those two losses to fuel us to close out matches," Williams coach Dan Greenberg said. "It's hard to describe these seniors and the four-year process they've been on. They have been dreaming about this since they were freshmen and they just cared so much. The younger guys have followed their lead."

Williams last won the championship in 2002, two seasons before Greenberg became a player there.

"This is going to feel amazing," Greenberg said, "but right now it hasn't sunk in yet."

Williams' senior captain, Trey Meyer, lost his two matches, falling with his No. 1 doubles partner, Alex Schidlovsky 9-8(5) to Joe Dorn and Zhenya Pereverzin, and dropping his No. 1 singles match to Dorn, 7-6(2), 6-2, but could not have been happier after hoisting the national championship trophy.

"We obviously had this goal when we were freshmen, but it was far-fetched," said Meyer. "This has been a process since before we were freshmen.

"The seniors when I was a freshman taught us how to compete and the captains my middle two years, Will Petrie and Kevin Shallcross, really brought this program to the next level. They really set this up for us. They taught us how to lead and this is the culmination of what we have been working toward for over a decade. I couldn't be more pleased, but I am also excited to see where this program goes."

"Trey has been more than just our captain," Greenberg said. "He has been my assistant coach in many ways. This definitely would not have happened without him."

Williams became the first school since Emory in 2006 to win the Division III men's and women's championships in the same season. The Ephs women defeated Emory for the title earlier in the day May 22.

"Obviously, I will never lose touch with these guys," Meyer said. "We constantly hang out together. This team really values academics and we are always studying together. Dan [Greenberg] always makes sure that is our No. 1 priority. Classroom, court and community — he calls them the three Cs. When you put those three things together, a day like this can happen."

Amherst beat Washington-St. Louis, 5-2, in the third-place match. Adam Putterman of Washington-St. Louis won the singles championship, rolling past Mark Kahan of Amherst, 6-3, 6-1. The Emory pair of Elliot Kahler and Ian Wagner captured the doubles title with a 7-6, 6-1 victory over Robert Kjellberg and Artsiom Prostak of North Carolina Wesleyan.
